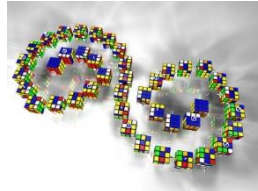
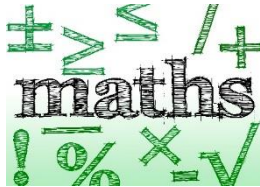




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# MATHEMATICS DEPARTMENT NEWS

A group of 30 Year 10 girls were invited to take part in Visa's International Women's Day celebration. The purpose of the event was to spark an interest in the girls to pursue a STEM related Career and provide a unique learning experience in a corporate environment where the students would meet other women to envisage for themselves what they could achieve by choosing a technology career.
