#### WHAT APPRENTICESHIP ARE YOU DOING/ WHAT LEVEL?

The apprenticeship that I'm doing is a BSc (Hons) in Digital and Technology Solutions Professional degree specialising in Cyber security bachelor's degree apprenticeship that is level 4, 5 and 6 after already completing my level 2 and 3.

#### WHAT IS YOUR JOB/ ROLE HERE AT QUEENS?

Here at Queens, I act as a senior IT technician which involves me providing support to the whole school. I help to install and repair as well as upgrade equipment, almost like a first line supporter.

#### HOW DID YOU FIND OUT ABOUT THE APPRENTICESHIP?

Degree apprenticeships are very competitive and can be hard to find but there are lots of different websites that have detailed information on them. It also depends on the type of industry you want to go into as there are more for computing than there are for English for example.

I found out about it by talking to my Level 3 teacher who had contacts at Hert University. They also advertised it on the university website too.

After I finished college I guess I just knew what I wanted to do and I knew the path I wanted to go down so my inspiration is myself in a way.

#### **HOW LONG HAVE YOU BEEN DOING THIS APPRENTICESHIP?**

Overall, the degree apprenticeship is 4 years long and I am currently in my third year. I have also completed both my level 2 and 3 as well.

#### WHY DID YOU CHOOSE THIS OVER OTHER PATHWAYS?

It's always something that I've wanted to do and after I completed my A-levels and from that I just thought that it was the next step to do. Doing a degree apprenticeship helps to give you the experience while also giving you a qualification at the end of it and it can also lead to permanent positions too.

#### HOW DID YOU FIND IT TO BEGIN WITH, WAS IT DIFFICULT?

When I first started it wasn't too difficult. I only go into uni one day a week which allows me to take the rest of the week to look back and reflect on what we did.

## HAVE YOU BEEN ABLE TO BALANCE THIS AND GOING TO UNI WELL AND WHAT IS THE MOST EXCITING PROJECT THAT YOU'VE WORKED ON?

For me, balancing it wasn't too hard, actually going into university is one day a week and it's actually a half day so I'm only there from 9-12. The most exciting project that I have done has to be a dragons den project we did. We had to pitch ideas and it was very interesting to do.

#### WHO HAS INSPIRED YOU AND WHY?

My biggest challenge has to be the modules that we have to do at university. Some of them are really difficult as they are completely different to what you are actually learning and it's really hard sometimes.


National Careers Week


