Year 8 COUNTY MATHS CHALLENGE

On Monday 29th April 2024 3 Year 8 teams represented Queens' School at the Hertfordshire County Maths Challenge HEAT 1. They competed against 15 other teams across Hertfordshire schools. It was hard but fun. They performed superbly well and ALL our teams scored over 100 points.

Two of our teams excelled and came 1st & 2nd place.

Year 8 **Team Makunde** took 1st place: Sé, Toby, Alfie & Sami.

They scored 208 points. (AMAZING score!!)

They also broke the county Maths Challenge record (56/60!!) in the estimation round.

Year 8 Team '**The Nameless**' took 2nd place: - Ruhe-Zahra, Yaprit, Nandhini & Anais

On Thursday 25th April the UKMT Junior Maths Challenge took place. This is a national competition for students in Year 7 & 8 and is very well regarded amongst educational settings.

This is a fantastic opportunity for the students who enjoy a challenge and our Year 7 and 8 students performed exceptionally well. We had 111 Year 7 and 120 Year 8 students take part. Students can achieve Bronze, Silver or Gold depending upon how well they score, moving onto further rounds if they reach the threshold.

YEAR 7

Gold - 1 student who goes through to the Kangaroo round

Silver - 18 students

Bronze - 37 students

YEAR 8

Gold - 19 students, 9 that go on to the Kangaroo round and 1 who goes on to the Junior Olympiad

Silver - 41 students

Bronze - 32 students

A SPECIAL MENTION has to go to Noah in Year 8 who has successfully gained entry into the Junior Olympiad competition. It should be noted that less than 1% of those that sit the Junior Maths Challenge are invited to sit the Junior Olympiad. A HUGE CONGRATUALIONS NOAH – We are very proud of you! Another well done to those students gaining entry into the Kangaroo round – a fantastic achievement.
